- Finances reviewed by Tom Ronksley
 - Current balance is \$22,561.00
 - o This was a good year for our investments.
- Report on the active club by Jamie Schiappa
 - o High initial interest in the freshmen but few really active members acquired
 - o Lack of planning by the actives has led to few outings
 - Pig roast was good this year despite dismal weather
 - Bought more slab wood → used 2.5 bundles this year
 - It is perhaps time to replace the posts of the roasting pit.
- The Cabin
 - Summer work outing
 - **2010**
 - Was pretty laid back this year with no big projects
 - Inspection of the floor joists yielded unfortunate news
 - **2011**
 - Plan to replace/double up many joists
 - Difficulty working in the tight space under the women's wing
 - o Can't lift up the floorboards because of replacement issues
 - There is the potential to lift up the cabin with hydraulic jacks.
 - o Future of the cabin
 - We cannot continue to simply patch the cabin.
 - We need to spend money to find out what we will need to do to the cabin.
 - Soil tests and etcetera
 - Need funding for this, about \$20,00
 - o Actives would like to help raise some money
 - Need actual cash, not a verbal commitment
 - Study grant from the college is a possibility
 - Axe and Saw
 - Will go out early this fall
 - Will contain a piece asking alumni to vote whether they wish to approach the college in regards to said grant with the options being:
 - Yes, by all means go ahead.
 - No, so here is my donation of \$____ to help fund the research.
 - Will contain a voting paper and return envelope for response.
 - A response will be required by an as yet undetermined date early in 2010.
 - Need to approach the game commission early-on to tell them our intentions
 - Building permits/ code

- Can't work on getting a permit because they have temporal limitations
- Not a private dwelling so would need to follow stricter codes
 - o Ex. Wiring, ADA compliance
- Some things that will need to change to meet code
 - Kitchen
 - Outhouses
- Road
 - Improving the road will be necessary to get equipment through
 - This can be done in a less obtrusive way
- Preservation
 - This would cost more than new construction
 - The hope is to preserve the look of the interior as much as possible by doing things like re-using the existing interior walls.
 - No matter what we do, the original purpose of providing a place of respite and rejuvenation for members, both actives and alumni, would continue.
- Construction time
 - Student/ Alumni access is a concern
 - Potential of building a pavilion to use in the interim
- Webinars
 - Need to conduct several to provide an open forum for information
 - Students and Cory Gibson will work on logistics
- Estimated building costs are \$250,000.
 - Getting this money will be difficult
 - With the wording of the deed it will be impossible to get a normal mortgage.
- It is a good idea to look at potential future funding involving the college soon.
 - Dick Jewell is in great support of the club, but he may retire in a few years.
 - His successor may not be so friendly towards the club.
 - The possibility of strings-attached risks will be carefully considered.

Cabin Access

- There are many keys out that we do not know about (ex. Frats)
- Electronic lock
 - Runs on 4 AA batteries
 - Eight digit number codes \rightarrow 3,000 possibilities
 - Each active and alumnus in good standing can have his or her own code
 - Codes can be deleted if improper use is noticed
 - Codes used are logged, so there is a record of who was using the cabin and when they were there.
 - The person who unlocked the door would be answerable regarding messes left behind.
 - Cory and Lee could have a few extras on hand all the time to give to people who drop by for the weekend, which could then be deleted after their stay.

- Easier than a physical key because it can be delivered over the phone rather than someone having to drive out of the way to get the key
 - o Especially convenient for Cory Gibson and Lee McCoy
- Does have a bypass key that cannot be copied.
- Potential for an RFID system added on for students
- Cost: \$500
- Cory Gibson is willing to fund, install, and maintain this device.
- Motion passed to install this at the cabin.
- o Officers
 - Secretary changed from Sarah Lang to Keegan Hange.
 - The other officers remain the same.
